



Certificate Qualifications

Normally, qualifications relate to the sector a person works in – for example, Certificate II Sawmilling and Processing.

Qualifications range from Certificate I, Certificate II, Certificate III, Certificate IV and Diploma for all industry sectors.

Although the Certificate doesn't name specific units, a Statement of Results from the RTO will show what units make up the qualification.
